Throughout the years, St. Nic's has been a significant spiritual home for many students past and present and has served as a training ground for emerging leaders in the church and community.

Over the last three years, we have been delighted to see our student group grow from a small, but quality, core of students, into a larger cohort of around 30 students with a mix of undergraduate and postgraduate from both University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent University. As both universities have become more international, so has our student group.

As a church, we have a reputation amongst the students for being a place where they can both belong and contribute, be known and know others of all generations and backgrounds.

Our student ministry has fed directly into our internship programme, which is run in partnership with the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham's Younger Leadership College and the Church of England's Ministry Experience Scheme. Interns explore their callings in all areas of their lives as they work alongside the church staff to shape specific areas of ministry.

ABOUT ST NIC'S

We are a city-centre Anglican Church, called to serve Nottingham and make disciples for Jesus. We come from a wide range of backgrounds; we are people of all ages; we work hard for unity across the churches. We are passionately committed to seeing transformation in individuals and communities through the Good News of Jesus, through welcoming people into authentic Christian community and through training in discipleship. Prayer is at the heart of all we do. We aim to be real, generous, welcoming and truthful. We don't like labels, but here are a few key words that may help.

Anglican

We are Anglican (Church of England). This means that we are part of a global network of churches. We support churches in inner-city and rural areas where other denominations struggle to survive. As Anglicans we have a rich spiritual heritage and we respect the leadership of our bishop.

Through Jesus, God wants to bring healing, and he uses us in the process.


There is also a strong Contemplative tradition in our church. This means that we value silence, listening to God in prayer and worship without words. Our faith also leads us into Social Action, taking practical steps to alleviate poverty, support the marginalised and seek justice.

We have four different services: Sundays at 9am, 10.45am and 6.30pm and a Spanish-speaking service (Amor Y Esperanza) on a Tuesday evening. The services each have their own leadership teams and meet slightly different needs but are united by a common vision. After the 6:30 pm service we lead After Hours which is a designated time for our 6:30 pm worshippers across ages and demographics to build community. Activities include pub quiz, coffee and tea, bring-and-share-puddings, student-led Bible/book study, outings to local eateries, and games nights.

We gather for breakfast and prayer on Wednesday mornings and seasonally for Central Prayer. We regularly join with wider prayer initiatives such as 24/7 prayer and City Prayer.

We gather during the week as medium sized communities which exist to help us grow in loving God, loving one another and loving the world. We also meet in smaller Core Groups of 3-4 people for support and accountability.

- Championing and overseeing student ministry and mission
- · Creating, implementing, and maintaining vision and strategy for student ministry and mission
- Planning and organising the student provision in an efficient way that enables others to function and flourish
- · Recruiting, training and mentoring student leaders, in particular the Student Team
- Leading, training, discipling and supporting students:
 - understanding and identifying the needs of students
 - using both existing and new structures to put appropriate support and discipleship measures in place
 - overseeing, organising and implementing our welcome strategy for new students (particularly in Autumn Term)
 - enabling students to fully participate and integrate in wider church life such as Communities, Core
 Groups, Amor y Esperanza, etc
- Maintaining relationships with student work organisations (primarily Fusion and UCCF) and other student workers in Nottingham (by attending student worker gatherings)
- Maintaining and managing the partnership with Friends International for St. Nic's Globe Café for International Students.
- Participating in and/or identifying and sending student representative(s) to the 6:30 pm worship planning meetings to shape the vision for 6:30 pm worship and After Hours for each term
- Line-managing the Student Worker Intern/s
- Taking part in the wider responsibilities that come with being a member of the Staff Team (including being an available presence at Sunday services both 10.45 and 6.30)
- · Participate in relevant training

- Maintaining and implementing vision and strategy for the internship programme in partnership with the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham
- · Recruiting and training interns in partnership with the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham
- Fostering an environment of learning, growth, and partnership for interns and partner ministries in St.
 Nic's
- Administration of the internship programme

- Organised and Strategic: seeing the bigger picture and planning ahead, as well as giving attention to details; an ability to manage time well and strategically
- · A Discipler of others: has a love for seeing others grow in faith and an ability to help them do this
- A Collaborator: works well with others in both listening to and sharing ideas
- Missionally-Minded: with a heart to inspire others to share the good news of Jesus and equipping them to do this more effectively
