## Week 1// Beginnings

Genesis 1-11

## Intro//

There are 1189 chapters in the Bible, but the first session focuses on just Genesis 1-11. Why? Because these opening chapters function like a telescope, a lens through which we see the big picture of God's interaction with history and humanity in broad brush strokes. ## **Discussion Questions//**

- 1. James pointed out that there are 1189 chapters in the Bible. Which chapter/chunk or passage of scripture is most meaningful to you and why?
- 2. James describes Genesis 1-11 as like looking at events through a telescope. How might this image help you make sense of the start of God's story?
  - a. If you looked at world events through a 'telescope' now, what would you notice?
- 3. What do the accounts of creation in Genesis 1 and 2 reveal about God's character?
- 4. How does both the 'content' of creation (*ch. 1-2*) and humanity's attempts to counter this (*ch. 3-11*) offer a different story from culture's account human origins and the state of the world?
- 5. How has God's word shaped your story and/or influenced your path in life? a. In what way might 'what God says' be challenging you right now?
